
HOW TO SWAB FOR RHEUMATIC FEVER

PICK YOUR BACTERIAL SWAB

It's **important** to use the **correct swab** when testing for Strep A.

General Bacterial Gel Swab Red/Blue cap swab with a clear gel medium.



LOCATE WHERE TO SWAB & COLLECT SAMPLE

Determine appropriate **Personal Protective Equipment** (PPE) and **clean hands** prior to donning PPE.

AFTER SWAB COLLECTION

- Place swab into gel medium
- Ensure specimen is labelled immediately after collection
- Place labelled swab into biohazard bag along with pathology request form
- Store and transport at room temperature
- Remove PPE and clean hands



Throat:

- Ensure back of throat or tonsils are swabbed, NOT the tongue or cheeks
- Sit patient comfortably upright with head supported
- Rotate swab slowly for 5-10 seconds and then withdraw swab



Skin:

- Clean skin with normal saline to remove debris/ slough prior to swab
- Press and rotate swab several times to extract fluid
- Avoid touching the swab to the outside edges of the wounds
- DO NOT swab from a wound dressing or pooled exudate
